

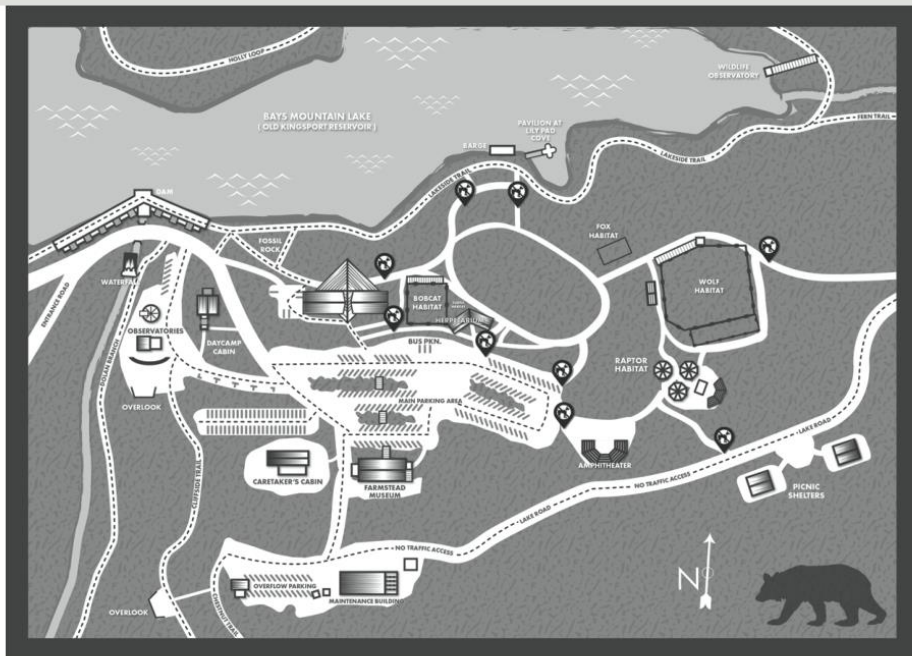
Bays Mountain Dog Trail Map and Policy

Bays Mountain Park Dog Policy

Bays Mountain Park is a designated natural area where wildlife are free to roam undisturbed. Park visitors should be able to enjoy native wildlife in their natural environment without the disruption by pets. Dogs are the only pets permitted at Bays Mountain Park. If you bring a dog to the park, there are a few rules that must be followed to ensure a great experience for all visitors:

- Dogs are NOT allowed in the animal habitat areas nor park buildings including the Nature Center, Herpetarium, and Farmstead. ONLY service dogs are allowed in park buildings. Signs are posted for your convenience.
- All dogs MUST be kept under physical control at all times on a physical lead or leash not exceeding six feet in length. Dogs are NOT allowed to run freely.
- Please be considerate and clean up your dog's feces.
- DO NOT leave your dog unattended or tied to an object.
- DO NOT leave your dog unattended in your vehicle. Police or animal control authorities will be notified.
- Bays Mountain Park is not responsible for any exchange of disease between your dog and wildlife.
- There is a possibility that your dog could become prey to a bear, coyote, owl, or other predator.
